ELIGIBILITY OF JUNIOR AND SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES

From time to time questions are asked as to the eligibility of those who are competing in Junior High or Senior High track or cross country. Can they compete in CTC events and what awards can they accept? Here is the definitive answer to these questions, provided by Coach Fred Kolkhorst:

There seems to be a general lack of understanding of the Missouri State High School Activities Association eligibility rules governing junior and senior high school athletes. This has caused some confusion as to when high school athletes may compete and what they may accept as awards. The following three items pertain to rules regarding participation in Columbia Track Club events and the receiving of awards. If an athlete or race director feels uncertain about a possible conflict with the MSHSAA eligibility rules, contact myself or Jack Miles, Executive Secretary of the MSHSAA.

- * A track or cross country athlete may compete in a nonschool race at any time except during the period from the school team's first day of practice through the state meet championship. (Exception: Cross country runners may compete in a non-school race from the period of the school team's first day of practice up until the opening day of school provided they do not attend cross country practice and compete in a non-school race on the same day.)
- * A high school athlete, not participating in track or cross country during the respective season, may participate in a non-school race at any time during the school year provided they do not attend a school practice or competition and compete in a non-school race on the same day. (Example: Boy's baseball and Girl's swimming athletes may compete in the Human Race held in the spring provided they do not attend a school practice or competition on that day. Boy's and Girl's track athletes are prohibited, regardless, from competing in that event because track is considered "in-season" at that time.
- * A high school athlete may accept only a medal, trophy, orcertificate as an award for their accomplishment in a school
 or non-school competition. Cash prizes, merchandise and
 t-shirts are all considered to be in violation of MSHSAA
 eligibility rules. (Clarification: High school athletes
 may accept souvenir items such as t-shirts when the cost of
 the item is included in the entry fee and given to all
 participants. An example of this is the t-shirt given to
 all Human Race participants.)
